

IPM Training Report

Country: Tanzania

Date of training: 20 - 24 September 2010

Venue: Mwanza (Lake Region)

1. Description of activities:

The training program was the full CropLife IPM Training course including additional sessions on:

- Pesticides – “From shop shelf to field”
- Refresher training – Training of Adults

4. Participant evaluation:

The knowledge of the participants was evaluated with a written paper (multiple answer questions) as well as an assignment consisting of (1) compulsory question and (2) questions which participants had to complete. The assignment was to test if participants will be able to apply knowledge learned in the field. All 14 participants received certificates of competence.

8. Master trainer comments:

It was the third IPM training course in Tanzania. The course was accepted very well by the participants. Again it was clear that if facilitated properly the IPM course is a very powerful training product for CropLife.

9. Results achieved since the second IPM training held at Mgorogoro in December 2009:

CNFA reported that over 800 agro input dealers were trained by CNFA trainers in IPM principles in the past 9 months. Further to this they are targeting to train more than 1000 agro input dealers in the next six months in a special project.

10. Next step:

CNFA needs another IPM course for the Aruza region. After completion of the requested IPM course, CNFA will have IPM trainers in all major regions of Tanzania.

Action to be taken:

Les Hillowitz to take up training needs for 2011 matter with CNFA
Herman Louw to give continuous support to CNFA trainers by mail.
