## **Objectives of the trip:**

- To facilitate a Training-of-Trainers program for the Mediterranean Agronomic Institute (MAIB)

## **Itinerary:**

- 20-21 March 2010: travel from Maputo to Bari
- 22-26 March 2010: ToT
- 22-23 March 2010: travel from Bari to Accra

## **Description of activities:**

### **1. Training-of-Trainers**

The ToT took place from 22-26 March 2010 at the Mediterranean Agronomic Institute in Bari, Italy. The program consisted of two parts: theory and practice on training and facilitation skills (3 days) and individual lessons (2 days). The following topics were discussed during the first part: preparation of a training program, adult learning, training methods and approaches, training aids, facilitation skills, and evaluation and follow up.

A total of 13 participants (8 male, 5 female) attended the program. All of them are Master Students IPM at the institute. Approximately half of them already had some experience as a trainer or facilitator.

The group dynamics were good and in general the atmosphere was fine. However, towards the end of the program, some students were more worried about their marks than concerned with learning, which resulted in an outburst of one of the students and nervous behaviour of others.

### **Evaluation**

The knowledge of every participant was evaluated with a written pre- and post test and during their individual lessons. All participants received a certificate of competence. The written test was very well made with an average of 83%, with the exception of one person who only scored 53%. The level of the individual lessons was good with an average score of 79%. All of them were well prepared and had made an effort to demonstrate their topic and to have an exercise. The main comment for improvement was that students did not use the result of exercises done by participants and that they were too much focused on their session instead of on the participants (and not listening to them). All students received a certificate of competence.

Besides knowledge, also the reaction of participants was evaluated (in short: did they like the program?). Each participant was asked to complete a questionnaire about the program (see at end of this report). Although marks for both the written test and the individual session were high compared to other ToTs, some students were disappointed by scores. This is mainly because they consider everything below 85% as a bad result, while in a ToT marks above 80% are considered as very good. The disappointment clearly showed in their evaluation. Besides, the direct way of evaluation after the individual sessions was new for most students and for some very difficult to accept.

Handouts of all sessions, a cd-rom with all presentations and documents of the training and all training topics on pesticides for agro dealers were distributed to all participants.
