- Attended and obtained all training materials for two day course on "Poisoning, Diagnosis and Treatment for Medical Personnel" by Dr James Ombega and Dr Jack Aston.
- Attended presentation by Belete Demissie on pesticide application, as part of two day Storekeepers course.
- Discussion and planning for future visits.
- Established that Ed Havis, a UK based consultant used by DFID is supporting the EHPEA - a useful contact, as he is a friend of mine.
- Meeting with EACA executive, regarding training and future training with FAO at ASP training in January.

ACTIONS REQUIRED

- Plan for future ASP training with FAO in January (GC, PM).
- Plan for future ToT courses (PM, GC).
- Present certificates to participants (GC).
- Present training manuals to participants (GC).
- Collate training materials from medical training (PM).
- Meeting with Dr Bitano, to persuade him to accept CropLife at FAO-ASP inventory and safeguarding training in Ethiopia in January (GC, JLA, JO).
- Meet with Ed Havis, the UK horticultural consultant and set up future training co-operation with DFID, who are sponsoring the Ethiopian Horticultural Producers and Exporters Association (PM).
- Collate application training materials from Belete Demissie's presentation (PM)
- Getachew must attempt to translate the manuals and presentations (GC).

CONCLUSION

Once again Getachew should be congratulated on organising these two training programs. And again good progress has been made. Hopefully we can in future get more co-operation with DFID, who are assisting EHPEA, through a UK based consultant Ed Havis, who is a good friend of mine!!

Once again, I need to comment that we would reach a far wider audience and range of participants, if we run training of trainers courses. Future training must only be ToT courses.

Getachew does need some equipment for further training, such as flip chart stands, laptop, projector. Can we look into this, please?

Discussions with Merid Kumsse may prove fruitful, and we may in future be included in the FAO Obstocks training due to take place in January. *Getachew* needs to follow up.

Very disappointing turnout of medical personnel - only 7 arrived of 22 invited. *Getachew* needs to follow up and ensure better turnouts in future.

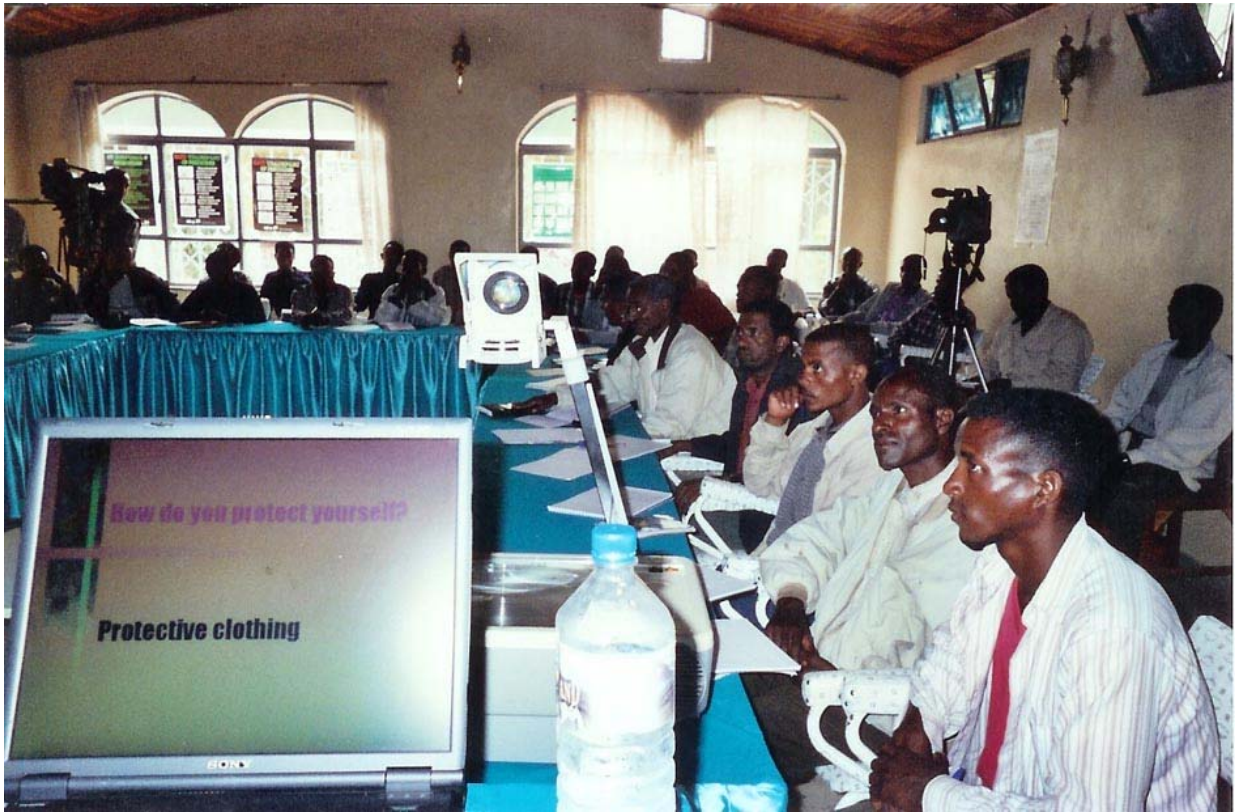
