### CONCLUSION

First opportunity to work directly with government in South Africa, following earlier request from Frank O'Brien, UK consultant. Although a few hiccups along the way, the course eventually went well, and participants were very enthusiastic about the course and the future.

Future plans for follow-up are the responsibility of the Department of Agriculture in Limpopo Province, in Polokwane. These possibilities include:

- 1. Another ToT course for more trainees.
- 2. A Follow-up course for these trainees (two days refresher and preparation, two days training others, one day feedback with trainers).
- 3. A More detailed technical course for these participants.

I believe it would be in CropLife South Africa's interests to maintain good relationship with the Department of Agriculture in Limpopo, as these and many other staff employed in the department and in colleges are very involved in training of farmers in agricultural practices, including responsible use of pesticides. So, more courses, by arrangement, as suggested above should be considered.


